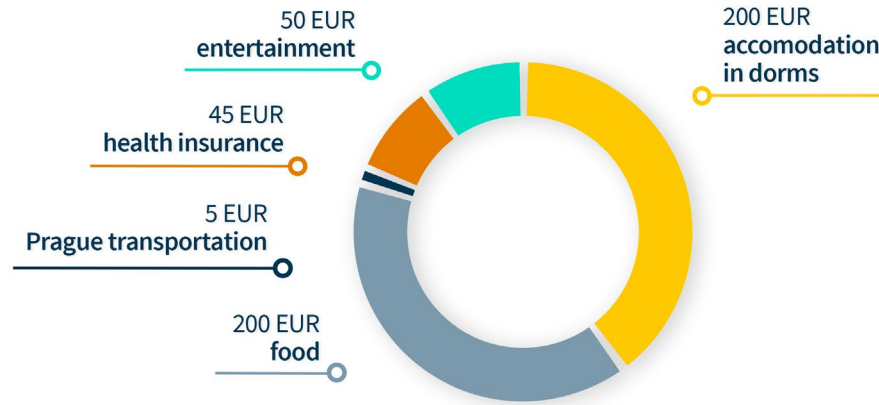

How to Apply

Official website of Czech consulate in your area

Režim „student“ (Rezim student)



Documents requirement (official website of appropriate Consulate)

Basic documents:

- Passport
- 2 document size pictures
- Application form
- Application fees (normal rate is 2500CZK)
- Letter of acceptance*
- Proof of accommodation*
- Proof of financial means*[∨]

Additional documents (depends on country):

- Criminal record extract*[∨]
- Other*[∨]

* - should not be older than 180 days

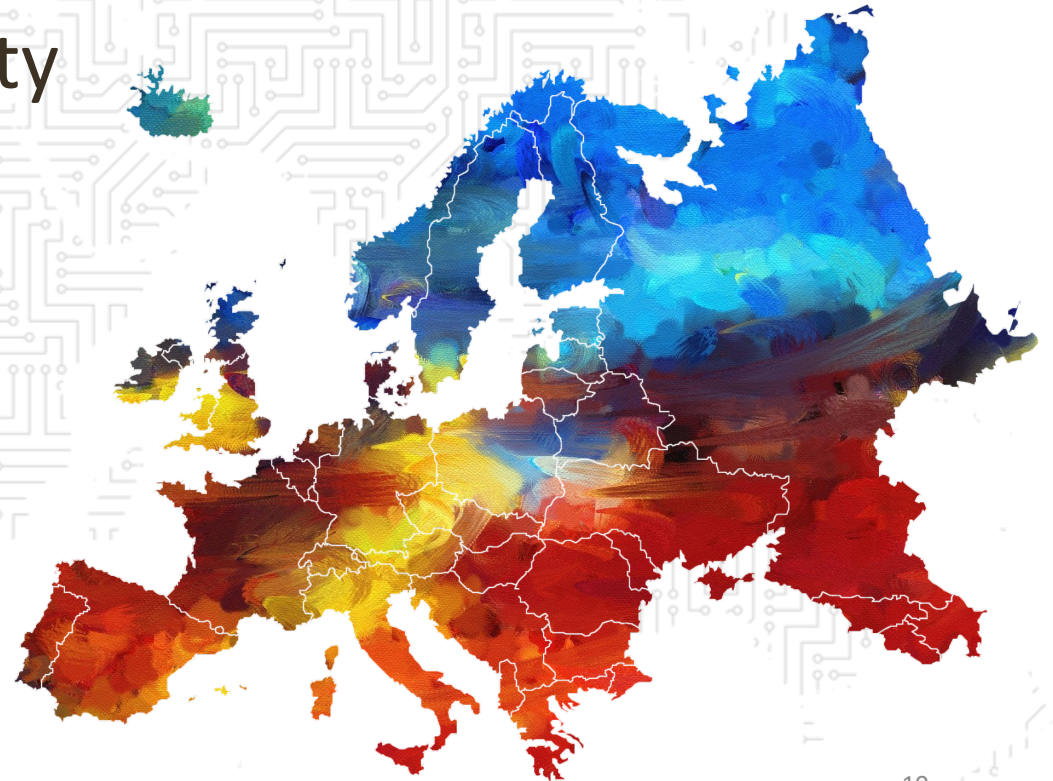
[∨] - should be officially translated into Czech



Visa Interview

Typical questions:

- about Czech Republic
- about VSE, your faculty, your major
- about your plans after the University



After Arrival Obligations

Accommodated at the university dormitory or not

- **EU** citizens
- **Non-EU** citizens with **long-term visa**
- **Non-EU** citizens with a **long-stay visa** issued for the purpose of collecting the long-term residence permit
- **Non-EU** citizens applying for the **long-term residence permit**

For visiting the Ministry of Interior/Department for Asylum and Migration Policy it is necessary to have an appointment reserved in advance. Therefore, we recommend making an appointment with the Ministry of Interior office <https://frs.gov.cz/en> right after you receive your visa in your country of origin and your date of arrival to the Czech Republic.

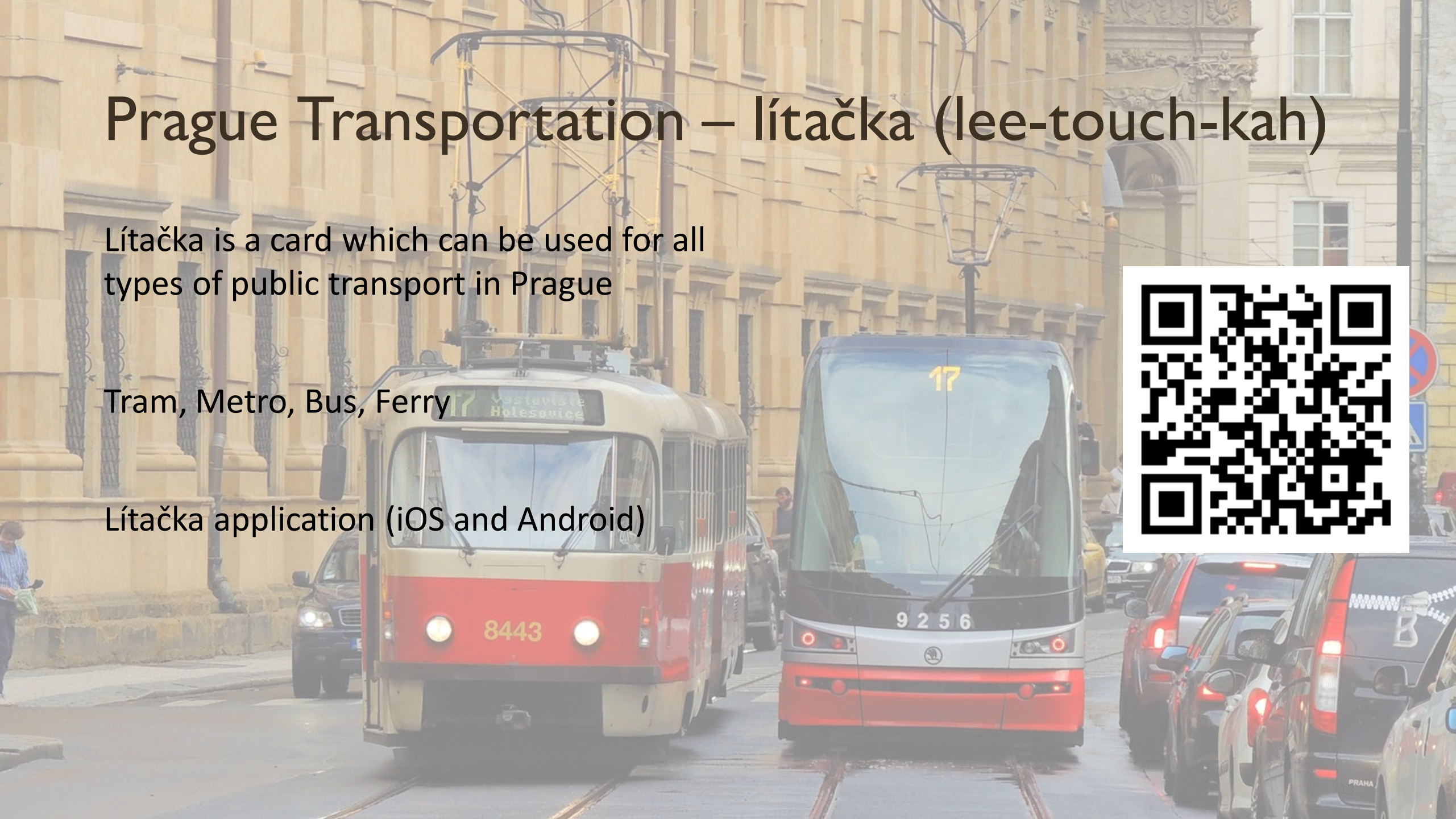


Prague Transportation – lítačka (lee-touch-kah)

Lítačka is a card which can be used for all types of public transport in Prague
